

Professor Sir Timothy Robert Peter Brighouse has spent his entire career working in education. Most recently he has served as London Schools Commissioner, working to improve education in the capital.

He was brought up in East Anglia, attended state schools and read history at Oxford University before embarking on his career as a schoolteacher and becoming a deputy head at 26. Later he was Professor of Education at [Keele University](#) (1989-1993) and Chief Education Officer in both Oxfordshire (1978-1989) and Birmingham Local Authorities.

He has written extensively especially on school improvement and has a number of books and articles to his name. He has also broadcast on radio and television and has spoken at many national and international conferences.

Tim has received honorary doctorates from The Open University, University of Central England, Oxford Brookes University, Exeter University, Warwick University, Birmingham University, University of the West of England and Sheffield Hallam University. He has also contributed articles to the Political Quarterly and the Oxford Review of Education.
